A. The patient had barricaded himself. They had to break up his door to bring him out. When he went in he was -- they had to chase him -- he tried to run away. They had to chase him to bring him to the medical emergency room. He was uncooperative with the medical treatment in the medical emergency room. He was agitated and uncooperative and that gives me a clue that he needed further evaluation.
